

## **ACTS Severe Food Allergy Policy**

The intent of this policy is to increase communication and awareness about allergens in an effort to reduce the possibility of exposure through direct consumption or cross-contamination. Parents and staff members should adhere to the following guidelines:

- 1.) Parents of students with severe allergies must:
  - a.) Provide the tutorial with medical documentation of a student's nut or other severe allergy.
  - b.) Collaborate with the medical care provider, tutors (annually), and tutorial administration to develop an emergency plan that will be followed in case an allergic reaction occurs.
  - c.) As requested by the teachers and/or administration, provide alternate food items for their children when it is not practical to ensure that the allergy can reasonably be accommodated (e.g., ACTS-wide events, field trips, etc).
  - d.) Be aware that the tutorial can make no guarantee or claim that ACTS events are free from allergens.
- 2.) In a class where there is a medically documented severe nut or other severe allergy:
  - a.) Tutors will clearly communicate with students and student families prior to the beginning of the school year to inform the entire class of the presence of a medically-documented allergy.
  - b.) All students, regardless of allergy status, will sit at their own desk for snack-time, and should not share or trade food with anyone else in the classroom.
  - c.) Following snack-time, students will thoroughly wash their hands and wipe down their desks and any surfaces they have touched while eating their snack.
  - d.) ACTS Administration, in coordination and with impacted tutors and families, may institute and communicate other procedures or restrictions on a case-by-case basis as needed.
- 3.) During an ACTS year where there is one or more students with a medically-documented nut allergy, nut-free food should be clearly labeled at communal events.
